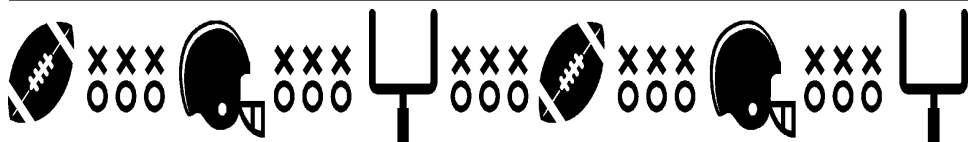
PASTOR'S MESSAGE

About Lent...

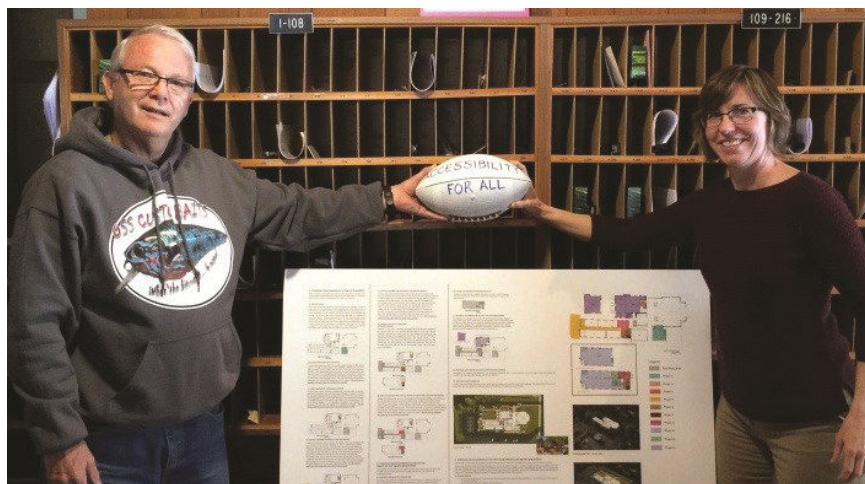
- ♦ The word "Lent" comes from Old English for "lengthen" as the days lengthen during spring.
- ♦ By the 4th century, Lent was widely used among Christians as a time for adult converts to prepare for Baptism at the Easter Vigil service.
- ♦ When adult Baptism became rare in the 12th century, Lent was used to prepare for Easter in various ways, including fasting, prayer and alms-giving (giving to the poor).
- ♦ Lutherans have always been very careful to avoid using the term "sacrifice" to describe Lent or anything in liturgy – Luther was very concerned to proclaim Jesus' sacrifice for us – and avoid thinking that we sacrifice anything for God.
- ♦ Beginning in the mid-20th century, a liturgical renewal occurred among most Christians, and since then, there's been an embracing of the older Christian traditions, including the emphasis on baptismal identity for Lent. For Lutherans, this happened first with the green hymnal (1978).
- ♦ Christians make a habit of marking time. Lent is marked as the most somber season – marking time to look at ourselves and see the truth – that we're turned in on the self. But it's also a season to see the truth about God, which is why the focus is Baptism – and the Holy Spirit's persistent work in calling, gathering and enlightening us as baptized, forgiven, beloved children
- ♦ Lenten opportunities to see the truth about yourself & about God:
 - ◊ Lenten Vespers – Wednesday evenings for ½ hour—the theme is "Baptized, We Live"
 - ◊ Lenten weekly devotions from Bread for the World
 - ◊ Holy Week – The Lutheran experience of an annual church revival! :-)
 - ◊ Aimed at younger children: Children's Good Friday Service
- ♦ What changes in **worship** during Lent?
 - ◊ We refrain from some of the more overtly triumph or victory-oriented actions – saving them for Easter; such as singing "Alleluia" and processing in a festive way.
 - ◊ We use the Apostles' Creed - the baptismal creed, which was originally created in the 4th century in order to be confessed at Baptism.
 - ◊ We typically sing the prayer response and allow for times of more silence

The 2015-2016 NFL Football Season will end February 7, 2016 with the clock running down on the Panthers and Broncos. The SMLC Facility Planning Task Force (FPTF), not to be outdone, extended the season by passing the **"ACCESSIBILITY FOR ALL"** football to the Congregation Council. The Council now needs to get the ball, hopefully, carried over the Goal Line. That "Goal Line" is represented by the three accessibility projects I outlined in the January *Messenger*. If accomplished, these three projects will increase the accessible square footage of our church campus from 34% to 62% (WOW). Council, in the next three months, will be developing a game strategy and plan to move our team (SMLC Congregation) and the football over the Goal Line. Team work by us all can yield a victory for us all! Stay tuned, as there will be more to follow in the coming months.

STEWARDSHIP

Thank You!



In November of 2015, the congregation was facing a very large financial crisis. We knew we were losing the revenue from an apartment and we were also \$17,000 behind in what was expected as contributions from the congregation. To address this problem we initiated an assertive Stewardship campaign for 2016 including identifying groups in the congregation with different needs for education, encouragement and evangelism.

Your response has been phenomenal. The stewardship campaign resulted in 148 *Estimate of Giving* cards totaling \$367,159. At this point last year, the totals were 125 pledge cards at \$302,878. This signifies an increased return rate of 18%. The more people who return estimate of giving cards helps the Treasurer and Finance Committee more accurately discern what the congregation will contribute in 2016 - hence, less risk of surprise or fewer "deficit appeals."

Clearly, God's blessings to you have been also passed onto our congregation and the people we serve.

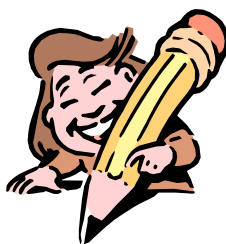

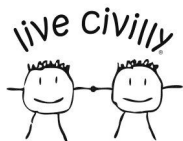

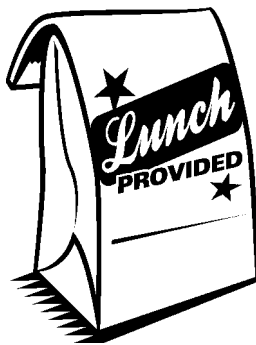


Lunch Bunch

A ministry that provides a full lunch, once a month, to the New Visions Homeless Day Shelter, Camden, NJ

For those who may not know, this ministry (operating with your support since March 2001) is dubbed the "Lunch Bunch." In a nut shell, its a monthly gathering of volunteers who prepare approximately 260 sandwiches for the folks at the New Visions Community Services Center. This lunch consists of 80 sandwiches ***each*** of ham & cheese, turkey & cheese and approximately 100 peanut butter & jelly sandwiches; chips, homemade cakes, cookies or brownies—all thanks to you bakers, bananas, drink mix, napkins and cups. We prepare the food on Thursday evening (always the second Thursday of the month) and then Dave Frech delivers it to the Center the next day in time for the Friday noon meal.



For the last seven plus years, the wonderful folks at Wegman's have provided the food to us with one-stop shopping at affordable prices. They have also donated money to help defray our purchases. This year they gave a gift card in the amount of \$480. Since our average monthly cost is \$190, this donation goes a long way in assisting us in the fight against hunger—one sandwich at a time.

We thank God for your continued support and would love to have you join us. Thanks a bunch—a Lunch Bunch!

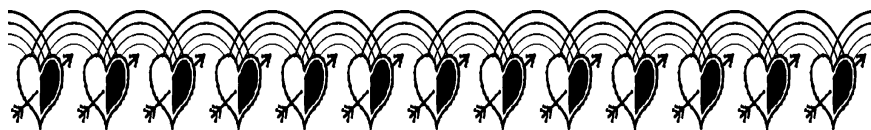
Youth Group Casserole Night

When we have a heavy heart!



There are times in our lives when even though our own lives are going well, we have heavy hearts because we have friends and/or family members going through serious health issues like chemotherapy. It is so difficult to see ones we love suffer.

What can I do? Or say? We feel so helpless and maybe even feel like we are failing our dear friends or family members.

A few ideas that I hope might help:

- ♦ Ask them what you can do and if they say nothing--- respect that for the moment.
- ♦ Assure them they are in your daily prayers.
- ♦ Perhaps just offer what we call "a cup of water" in Stephen Ministry! A note, a special treat that you just drop off unexpectedly, or a short phone call.
- ♦ One of the things folks dealing with chemo deal with is the **desire not to hug or shake** hands because of germs!!! As hard as it is, ask before hugging and allow them to say NO. This is a tough time of the year—for all of us—sometimes, we Pastors do not distribute the bread at Communion because we have colds, etc.!

Many times we think that having a Stephen Minister is only for the person dealing directly with an illness or crisis, but that is not so! Are you struggling with a heavy heart? If so, please contact Pastor Wengert to see about having a Stephen Minister for a short period of time—a loving person you can share your heart with on a regular basis.

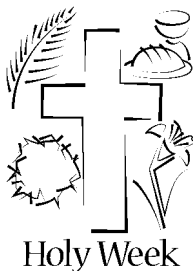
