PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Why doesn't St. Matthew capitalize pronouns referring to God?

We follow the practice of the wider church, religious publishers, and general publishers who began to adopt the lowercase or "down style" mid-century (i.e. "his" instead of "His").

In 1978 the Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW) continued the down style of the 1958 Service Book and Hymnal (SBH) in reversing the 19th century convention of capitalizing pronouns. "In line with modern practice, capitalization has been reduced in the LBW. The SBH like the Book of Common Prayer, no longer capitalized pronouns which referred to God – a nineteenth century innovation. The practice was not entirely consistent in any case; "he," "his," and "who" were regularly capitalized but "own" (grammatically an adjective) was not." (1978 LBW Note on Orthography)

"Many religious publishers and most general publishers have adopted the lowercase style, in large part to conform to the styles of the commonly used versions of the Bible. It is the style recognized as contemporary by the greatest number of readers and writers both inside and outside the church. Because capitalizing the deity pronoun, as well as a vast number of other religious terms, was the predominate style in late nineteenth- and early twentieth-century publishing, it gives a book, at best, a dated, Victorian feel, and at worst, an aura of complete irrelevance to modern readers.

Contrary to popular opinion, capitalization is not used in English as a way to confer respect (we capitalize both God and Satan, Churchill and Hitler). . . . Capitalization is largely used in English to distinguish specific things from general." (Zondervan Style Manual)

In 2011, even the press association of the Christian movement, Evangelicalism, that continues to follow the 19th century convention, the Evangelical Press Association, noted, "...the lack of capitalized pronouns doesn't necessarily need to be seen as a sign of disrespect. The King James Version, which celebrates its 400th anniversary this year, does not capitalize pronouns that refer to God. Neither do several other historic English Bible translations, including those by Wycliff (1380) and Tyndale (1534). And, of course, the Greek and Hebrew manuscripts on which our translations are based do not capitalize pronouns that refer to God."

The gospel (good news) of Jesus Christ remains the same; that is, almighty God passionately loves and unconditionally forgives us. However, the way in which people communicate the gospel has changed through generations, eras and cultures, and will continue to change, so that the message can be heard as *really being* "for you" and me.

INTERNSHIP APPEAL

Monday, March 24, 2016

Dear Members and Friends of Saint Matthew Lutheran Church, We're eager to let you know that we have an opportunity to host a seminary intern, John Nelson, beginning in August, 2016.

What is Internship?

Internship is the main way that the Evangelical Lutheran Church in American (ELCA), partners with congregations to develop people for the ordained ministry. Field education, internship, Clinical Pastoral Education, and seminary graduation are all part of the comprehensive candidacy process that helps individuals and the ELCA discern and eventually approve candidates for ordained ministry.

Why now?

The Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia approached Saint Matthew and requested that we consider hosting another intern. The last intern we hosted was 2013-2014, the now Rev. Ryan Paetzold.

The Congregation Council knows the timing isn't ideal given the current capital appeal phase I (maintenance projects), and the pending capital appeal phase II (accessibility projects). However, we thought the opportunity was such a critical one for the wider church and also a profound opportunity for our congregation, that we decided to hold a special appeal to determine whether the congregation can fund this internship.

Saint Matthew has a reputation as a good teaching congregation in terms of gifted people, passion for teaching and knowledge. Internship is a mutual blessing as the congregation itself seemed to be enlivened and energized by hosting "Vicar Ryan." John Nelson has many gifts, including teaching, and would be thrilled to complete his internship at Saint Matthew.

Internship Financial Appeal

Contributors in the congregation have already committed \$7,200 to support an intern. The Memorial Fund may contribute \$5,000, and there is \$4,043 of designated memorials and gifts available. Thus, we have a probable **total of \$16,243** of financial support for this internship.

The **estimated costs** of hosting an intern are **\$22,500**, which includes a stipend, fees, and costs associated with housing. The intern would live in the church apartment located in the Hassinger building behind the 7-11, which was originally built to house pastors or interns, and was vacated in September by a long-term tenant.

In order to support an intern, we would need an **additional \$6,257**. **Would you consider making a commitment?**

If so, we're looking to receive email or written commitments **by April 17**. At this point, we are requesting that you fill out a green commitment card (in foyer) or send an email to the church office (<u>stmatthew@verizon.net</u>). Given enough support from the congregation by April 17, we would then communicate again, inviting you to make the actual contribution, beginning September 2016.

Stephen Ministry's Other Ministry



We all know about the one-on-one approach Stephen Ministers use when supporting people who are hurting, but there is another ministry many St. Matt's members may not know about—that other ministry is sending "Journeying through Grief" booklets; a set of four, easy-to-read booklets

offering words of comfort and hope to those grieving the loss of a loved one.

St. Matthew sends"Journeying through Grief" booklets to grieving members at crucial times during that first year after a loved one dies. Each booklet focuses on what the person is likely to be experiencing at that time and provides care, encouragement, assurance and hope. Although the booklets are designed to help those during the first year of grief, people whose loss happened more than a year ago have also found them helpful and supportive.

So, even though most of us have not completed the extensive training it takes to be a Stephen Minister, individuals can extend Stephen Ministry support by sending the "Journeying through Grief" booklets to those we know and care about outside the congregation who are grieving. The booklets, with envelopes and suggested words of support, may be purchased from StephenMinistry.org.

ELCA NEWS

Easter is early this year, and in many places across this church trees will still be bare and fields barren. It might even snow. But on Easter morning we will gather to greet the risen Son and give thanks to God for the new life we have in Jesus Christ.

Two things come to mind this Easter when there is still only the hint of spring: Jesus' words to his disciples just before his crucifixion and a hymn.

Jesus said, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." Jesus was talking about his death, but he was also assuring his disciples and us that death is not the end, that, though it might seem impossible and even terrifying to step into the void, God brings life out of death.

The hymn is ELW 379.

Now the green blade rises from the buried grain, wheat that in dark earth many days has lain; love lives again, that with the dead has been; love is come again like wheat arising green.

The tune is actually a French Christmas carol. How perfect that, in the bleak midwinter, the promise of spring was planted.

St. Paul wrote, "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" We have already fallen into the earth and died. "For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." We will not remain alone. We will bear fruit.

The seed has been planted in all the barren places in the world and in our lives. That gives us the power and the hope — especially in the face of our brokenness — to see life where the world only sees death ... in refugee camps and hospice units, in parched earth and in floods, in oppression and denied justice we are bold to confess. Now the green blade rises. Now love lives again. Now love comes again like wheat arising green.
