5	EPA issued a proposed rule, titled "Strengthening Transparency in Regulatory Science." The stated aim is to increase transparency in the data that EPA uses to develop regulations. However, the rule would mean that some of the most important research of the past decades — for example, studies linking air pollution to premature deaths and measuring human exposure to pesticides — would not be available to policymakers if scientists were unwilling to break the confidentiality agreements they struck with study subjects in order to collect sensitive personal information. 6	The US EPA and NHTSA has proposed rolling back fuel efficiency standards that would require automakers to improve fuel efficiency to 54.5 miles per gallon by 2025. If fully implemented, the rules would have cut oil consumption by about 12 billion barrels and reduced carbon dioxide pollution by about six billion tons over the lifetime of all the cars affected by the regulations.
